## **Dr. Lori Martin**

Lori Latrice Martin, a Nyack native, is a Professor in the Department of Sociology and African and African American Studies at Louisiana State University (LSU) and an LSU Faculty Athletic Representative. Dr. Martin was born and raised in Nyack, New York. Some of you may have first learned about Dr. Martin's research when you read a February 2015 Nyack Sketch Log titled 'Scholar Puts Local History on Global Map', a Bill Batson article about her efforts to save an important figure in local history, Cynthia Hesdra, from obscurity. The impact of research and writing culminated in the May 18, 2015 dedication of a monument to Hesdra that is located in Memorial Park. The monument is part of the global initiative sponsored by the Toni Morrison Society's Bench by the Road project. Seven years before this fame, Dr. Martin published The 'Ex-Slave's Fortune: The Story of Cynthia Hesdra after her curiosity during an economics research project led her to investigate the history of this 19<sup>th</sup> century female entrepreneur – an ex-slave who own real estate, a thriving business and who also served as a conductor on the underground railroad. Dr. Martin holds degrees from Fordham University, University at Buffalo, and University at Albany. Dr. Martin is a much cited author of many scholarly works on race and ethnicity, racial wealth inequality and black asset poverty, and race and sports. Her most recent publications include ***Big Box Schools, White Sports Black Sports***, and ***South Baton Rouge***. You can find Dr. Martin on TedTalks LSU (Why it's time to pay to play).
