- Images are for personal use only and may not be loaned, sold, or given to any agency, person or organization
- The integrity of the image must be maintained; it may not be used in a misleading or defamatory context
- In authorizing the reproduction of images in its collection, The Nyack Library does not surrender its own right to publish the image, or for others to do so
- Use of materials complies with any agreements which may exist between The Nyack Library and donors
- Use of the image complies with current copyright restrictions
- If the image is included in a published work, a copy of the completed work must be given to The Nyack Library free of charge
- Images should be attributed to: "The Nyack Library Local History Image Collection"
